

Milky Way Ice Cream

A perfect treat for the summer heat



What you'll need!

4 ounces Milky Way candy bars, chopped

1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk

1 cup whole milk

1 cup half-and-half

1/2 cup chocolate syrup (optional)



Directions

Melt the candy bars and condensed milk in a heatproof bowl set over a saucepan of simmering water, stirring, until smooth (do not let the bowl touch the water). Remove the bowl from the saucepan and whisk in the milk, half-and-half and chocolate syrup. Refrigerate until cold, at least 2 hours.

Churn the mixture in an ice cream maker. Transfer to an airtight container and freeze until firm, at least 2 hours.
